Prof. Maria Kakavoulia holds a Ph.D in Modern Greek Studies from the University of Birmingham, UK (1992). She is Associate Professor in Rhetoric and Narratology in the Department of Communication, Media and Culture at Panteion University in Athens, Greece.

She has published three books on the poetics and aesthetics of Greek literary texts: "Studies on Narrative Discourse" (2003); "Interior Monologue and its Discursive Formation in Melpo Axioti's Prosework 'Difficult Nights' (1992); and "Figures and Words in the Work of Eleni Vakalo" (2004), which won the first Greek state prize for Essay and Criticism in 2005.
