

The MGSA awards four highly competitive prizes for Greek scholarship. Open to scholars at all points in their careers, these prizes make sure Greek studies are part of the scholarly conversation.

The Edmund Keeley Book Prize is awarded to an author writing about modern Greece or a Hellenic theme, published originally in English. This prize contributes to the widespread dissemination of Greek scholarship in the English-speaking world.

The Elizabeth Constantinides
Memorial Translation Prize
raises the profile of contemporary
Greek literature by recognizing an
exceptional, new translation into
English of a literary work published
in Modern Greek.

The John O. Iatrides Best
Dissertation Prize is awarded
biennially at the MGSA Symposium
for the best English-language
dissertation on a Greek subject,
serving to connect the humanities
and social sciences with the postByzantine Greek world and
Greek diasporas.

The 2015/2017 Victor S. Papacosma Graduate Student Essay Prize is awarded for an essay dealing with the post-Byzantine Greek world. This prize infuses the MGSA with fresh scholarly viewpoints and supports the recipient with a cash award, reimbursement for attendance of the Association's Symposium, and one-year membership in the MGSA.
